Information for candidates – Criteria for application

UEG wants to support emerging digestive healthcare specialists and those from underrepresented groups and give them the possibility to actively participate in UEG projects, based on their qualification and skills.

You can apply for specific tasks, but you have to prove your qualification. Your application will be reviewed and – if suitable – sent to the respective programme committees or working groups. You can update your application any time.

1. Before applying

Make sure:

- Are you qualified to apply for the specific tasks (see item 5)?
- Have you made yourself familiar with the programmes in which you would like to be involved?
- Do your application documents include the required information and comply with the format guidelines (see item 3)?

2. Basic criteria

Only candidates who fulfil the minimum criteria will be considered:

- all digestive health specialists (incl. surgeons, paediatricians, radiologists, pathologists,...) with an MD or basic/clinical scientists at pre/post PD/PhD level
- fluent in English
- can provide written recommendation by a UEG National or Ordinary (Specialist) Member Society, or a UEG affiliated person (e.g. member of a UEG Board or Committee) that refers to the specific task
- excellent one-sentence pitch

3. Application

- **Application form:** information about yourself, most important publications, your research focus in one sentence, tasks you would like to participate in
- **Curriculum vitae:** max. 1 A4 page (longer CVs are not accepted), incl. short summary of your medical/scientific education, previous relevant experience (e.g. invited talks, volunteer work, editorial work, review work), previous relevant participation in UEG-related activities, summary of publication records (see item 6)
- **Recommendation letter:** max. 1 A4 page (longer letters are not accepted), incl. your strengths and justification of your suitability for the task(s) you are applying for (generic letters are not accepted), contact details of the person recommending you
- **English language qualification certificate** (not mandatory), must be internationally recognised, e.g. IELTS or TOEFL

4. Selection

Your application will be reviewed and – if suitable – sent to the respective programme committees or working groups. The final selection of speakers/authors/contributors is at the responsible committees' discretion, so applying is no guarantee that you will be offered a task in the end. Also, you might not be considered for this year's congress/course/programme, but maybe next year.

We will only get in touch if we have found a suitable task for you, please understand that we cannot provide regular updates about the status of your application. Please **update your Talent Pool profile regularly** to increase your chances to be selected.

5. Available tasks and required qualification

Make sure you only select tasks that you are qualified for and that your motivation and recommendation letter refer to these tasks.
