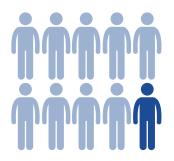


# **Alcohol Consumption**



9 in 10 people are unaware that alcohol increases the risk of cancer<sup>(1)</sup>

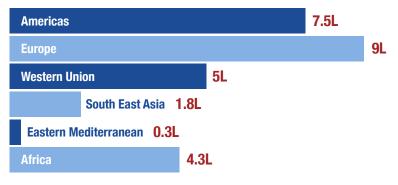


Europe drinks on average 50% more alcohol than the rest of the World



One fifth of the European population aged 15 and above are drinking in an harmful and hazardous way at least once a week<sup>(2)</sup>

## **Pure Alcohol Consumption**



Recorded annual alcohol consumption per capita in litres of pure alcohol<sup>(3)</sup>

# There is no safe limit in drinking alcohol. Regularly drinking above recommended limits may increase the risk of cancer. If you drink alcohol of any type, limit your intake. Not drinking alcohol is better for cancer prevention.

## **Consumption in Europe**



The highest rates of alcohol abuse in Eastern Europe are recorded in Romania and Czech Republic



Statistically, the lowest consumption of alcohol in Europe is recorded in Turkey and Malta

### **Alcohol Use**



Each year in Europe alcohol cause 155 billions euros of social and health costs
