
### **Alcohol-related Cancers**



Alcohol is linked to 7 different types of cancer<sup>(1)</sup>

#### **Cancer Deaths**




135,000 alcohol-related cancer deaths predicted by 2035<sup>(11)</sup>

# **Digestive Cancers**



Light, moderate, and heavy alcohol consumption increase the risk of digestive cancers<sup>(11)</sup>

## Risk



15 - 44 yo

Only about one in four women knows that alcohol is a risk factor for breast cancer<sup>(4)</sup>

#### Cause




In 2019, within the WHO European Region, about 180,000 cases of cancer and almost 92,000 cancer deaths were caused by alcohol<sup>(3)</sup>

## Consumption



In 2018, 6,865 breast cancer cases resulted from daily consumption of alcohol equivalent to 1–2 glasses of wine. (25% of the cases)<sup>(3)</sup>

### **Liver cancer**



Heavy alcohol consumption is associated with a greater risk of liver cirrhosis and liver cancer<sup>(10)</sup>

#### **Breast Cancer**



Even one drink a day raises breast cancer risk by 14%<sup>(4)</sup>

#### **Gastric Cancer**



Research shows that beer increases the risk of gastric cancer<sup>(2)</sup>
