

Submitting a late-breaking abstract often raises practical and procedural questions, especially for authors preparing their work for the first time or working with guidelines. This FAQ brings together the most common points that arise and offers clear guidance to support you throughout the submission process of a late-breaking abstract.

**Please note that late-breaking abstract category is not intended to offer a second deadline for standard abstract submission.**

**1. *Until when can I submit my late-breaking abstract?***

Monday, September 7, 2026, 10:00 CEST.

**2. *When will I get notified whether my late-breaking abstract has been accepted?***

Notifications will be sent out on Friday, September 25, 2026.

**3. *Do I need to register as a late-breaking abstract presenter?***

Yes, the presenting author must register for the congress by October 1, 2026, or withdraw the late-breaking abstract. Presenters will benefit from the extended early bird registration fee.

**4. *How much does it cost to submit a late-breaking abstract?***

Submitting a late-breaking abstract for UEG Week is completely free of charge.

**5. *Can I present my late-breaking abstract virtually?***

No, accepted late-breaking abstracts will be presented orally during dedicated late-breaking abstract sessions. In-person presentation and registration are mandatory for the presenter.

**6. *Can I edit an already submitted late-breaking abstract?***

Yes, simply log in to the late-breaking abstract submission system and edit your submission. After editing your submission, you must submit your late-breaking abstract again. Please note that edits are only possible until the Late-breaking abstract Submission deadline of September 7, 2026, 10:00 CEST.

**7. *Who can present the late-breaking abstract?***

The presenter must be a listed author of the late-breaking abstract and must be registered for UEG Week.

**8. *Can the presenting author be changed after the submission?***

Yes, the presenting author can be changed in the late-breaking abstract confirmation system until October 1, 2026. Please send an email to

[uegweek.abstract@abstractserver.com](mailto:uegweek.abstract@abstractserver.com) to request a change to the presenting author after this deadline.

**9. *Where can I upload my presentation?***

Presentation slides are to be uploaded online or onsite at the Speaker Centre at least 3 hours before your presentation. Further information will be communicated to late-breaking abstract presenters upon acceptance of their abstract.

**10. *Is the use of the presentation template mandatory?***

Using the UEG template is not mandatory, although we recommend using it to help participants navigate through the different presentations. However, it is **mandatory to use the COI slide** as your second slide in the presentation. Industry slide templates containing logos are not allowed. Industry logos are only permitted on the last slide of your presentation.

**11. *Where does my accepted late-breaking abstract get published?***

Late-breaking abstracts are published in the *UEG Abstract Book 2026* and on the congress platform. Once the platform closes (approximately one month after the event), late-breaking abstracts will be available on [Gutflix](#).
